Our caravan will explore the Nile River cities of Cairo and Luxor, as well as down the Red Sea coast to the Arab desert to stand in the sand of ageless time. Our travels will take us from the Great Giza Pyramids, to magnificent mosques, Pharaonic temples and to the oldest monastery in the world.

We will float on the life-giving waters of the great Nile River, smell the aromas of exotic spices piled high in a bustling *souk*, savor flatbread freshly baked in a clay oven, visit a Bedouin tent-shaped cathedral, hear the Muslim call to prayer from over a thousand minarets, stand on the shore of the Red Sea, experience the Sufi dancing of whirling dervishes, explore whale bones in the Western desert and so much more. All along, we will experience ancient and living spiritual traditions – Pharaonic, Islamic, Sufi, Coptic, Jewish, and desert spirituality.



To enhance our journey, art will be woven throughout our caravan - Coptic, Islamic, Ancient Pharaonic and contemporary Egyptian art. We will visit the new Grand Egyptian Museum on the Giza Plateau, marvel at the architecture of Pharaonic temples, see rock carvings in a sandstone amphitheater, contemplate ancient monastic frescoes and Coptic iconography, admire Islamic calligraphy, visit the studios of today’s premier Egyptian artists, and stand at the foot of the majestic Great Pyramid of Giza, and so much more.

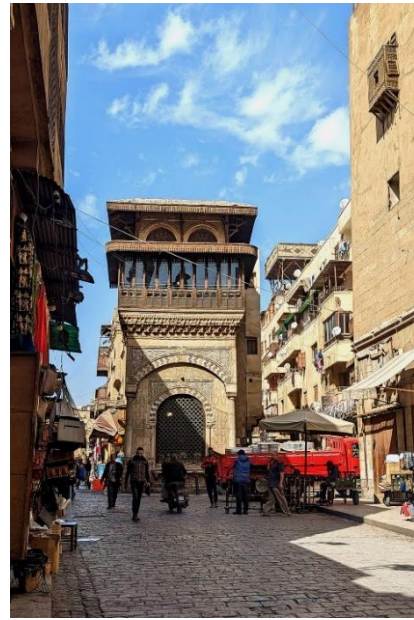

- Tanoura Sufi dancing in evening – Whirling Dervishes

- Visit a new art exhibition by CARAVAN artist Hady Boraey at Villa Magenta (in Heliopolis) and hear from the artist himself.



- Drop-off at Cairo Domestic Airport and fly to Luxor: EGYPTAIR MS 066 CAI to LXR – Dep 1800 / Arr 1905
- Transfer to overnight at Hilton Hotel Luxor

We will explore how the ancient Egyptians left behind an immense collection of spiritual knowledge through their architecture, hieroglyph, art and symbols.

### **LUXOR - then fly to CAIRO**

#### **Visit:**

- Visit Karnak Temple in ancient Thebes  
-The Karnak Temple took over 2,000 years to build and is the largest building ever constructed for religious purposes, which includes the Temple of Amun-Re and the Sacred Lake.
- Mid-afternoon flight to Cairo:  
EGYPTAIR MS 075 LXR-CAI DEP/ARR 15:40-16:50  
-Transfer to back to original hotel in Cairo  
-Steigenberger Hotel Tahrir

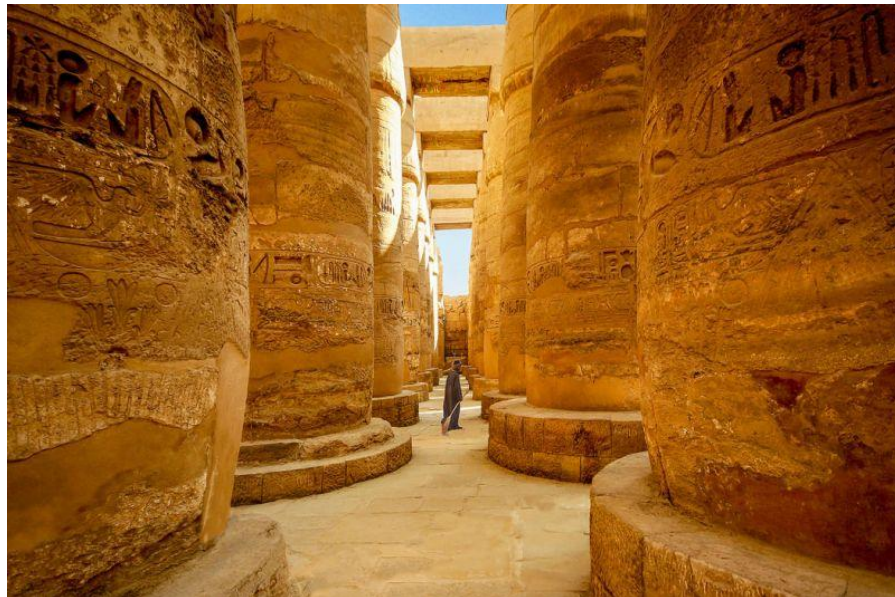
Breakfast: at hotel (check out luggage)

### **GRAND EGYPT MUSEUM**

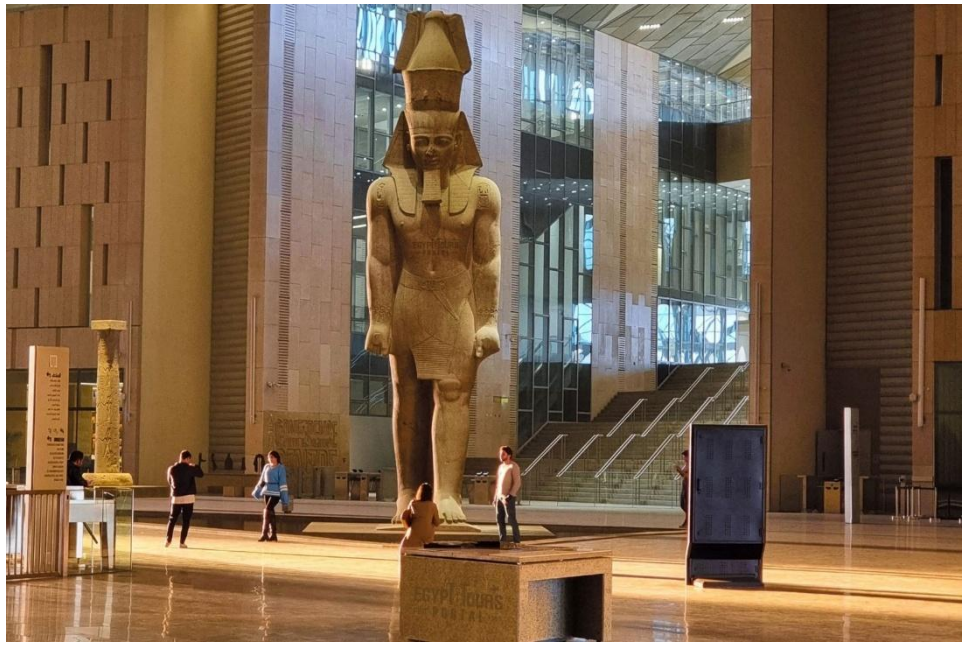
- Visit the brand new Grand Egyptian Museum, the largest museum in the world, including the spectacular display of King Tut and King Khufu's solar ship.
- Followed by last minute shopping/packing in Cairo or a time of rest or an optional tour of Zamalek Island art galleries.

# CARAVAN EGYPT TOUR

## “AT A GLANCE”

(October 26 – November 6, 2025)

### **SUN 26 OCT:**

**Arrival day** – Cairo airport “Meet and Greet” and hotel transfers.

### **MON 27 OCT:**

**Islamic day #1** – visit the Museum of Civilization, the Citadel, Mohamed Ali Mosque, Sultan Hassan Mosque & Madrasa (school), experience the Muezzin call to prayer, Ibn Toulon, and Al Azhar Mosque.

### **TUES 28 OCT:**

**Coptic day #1** – visit Coptic Christian Old Cairo including the Coptic Museum, Hanging Church, Ben Ezra Synagogue, Cave Church and Recycle Center, Anglican Cathedral, lunch on the Nile in a felucca sailboat.

### **WED 29 OCT:**

**Fayoum Oasis day** – visit Whale Bones Valley (UNESCO World Heritage Site) via 4x4 vehicles, lunch in the desert, Premier Egyptian artist Mohammad Abla’s art center, pottery village.

### **THURS 30 OCT:**

**Islamic day #2** - Walking tour of El Moez Street (visit the gate of Bab Zuweila), visit Tentmakers Market (Egyptian fabric artists) and Islamic Art Museum, Nile Maxim dinner cruise with show.

### **FRI 31 OCT:**

**Coptic day #2** – visit St Anthony, the oldest monastery in the world and the art of St Paul’s Monastery in the Arab Desert, lunch at a coastal resort on the Red Sea, visit with a Coptic iconographer.

### **SAT 1 NOV:**

**Pharaonic day #1** – visit Sakkara Pyramids, Necropolis & Dahshur, Wissa Wassef art center, Khan El Khalili bazaar shopping, Tanoura (whirling dervishes) show in evening

### **SUN 2 NOV:**

**Pharaonic day #2** – visit the Great Pyramids of Giza and the Sphinx, camel rides, visit a new art exhibition by CARAVAN artist Hady Boraey in Heliopolis and hear from the artist himself. Fly to Luxor.

### **MON 3 NOV:**

**Luxor day #1** – visit the Valley of the Kings, Hatshepsut Temple, Sunset Tour of Luxor Temple.

### **TUES 4 NOV:**

**Luxor day #2** – Karnak Temple in ancient Thebes, fly back to Cairo for a presentation over dinner by a Sufi teacher on Sufism and hear from a CARAVAN Sufi artist.

### **WED 5 NOV:**

**Grand Finale** - Visit the brand new Grand Egyptian Museum and experience the magnificence of the King Tut exhibition, last minute shopping/packing/rest, goodbye dinner at hotel.

**THURS 6 NOV:** – *departure early AM (middle of the night) or later in morning of Nov 6.*



## COSTS

**Double occupancy** (one or two beds): \$4,600

**Single occupancy:** \$5,700

*If you are traveling alone but wish to share a room, please let us know when you register and we will attempt to find a suitable traveling companion. If we are unable to find someone, we will notify you of the supplemental cost needed for a single room.*

### **INCLUDED IN TOUR COSTS:**

- “Meet and Greet” before passport control at airport, transfer from/to airport
- Egyptian visa – provided upon arrival by “Meet and Greet” agent before passport control
- All ground transportation
- In country flight: Cairo to/from Luxor - Star Alliance Partner EgyptAir
- Hotel lodging at 4 and 5-star hotels
- All meals of breakfast, lunch and dinner (drinks: bottled water at meals and on bus)
- Private tour bus throughout the trip
- All entrance fees to sites
- Our own dedicated tour guides throughout the trip
- Tour hosted by President of CARAVAN Arts

### **NOT INCLUDED IN TOUR COSTS:**

- International travel to and from Egypt
- Required travel health insurance and suggested comprehensive travel insurance (protection for cancellations, trip interruptions, lost baggage)
- Personal expenses
- Beverages: (coffee/tea/juice included at breakfast & water at meals and bus)

### **PAYMENTS:**

After reviewing your inquiry form, we will email you further instructions on the registration process, including needed forms and payment options to submit a deposit of \$500 per person, along with a schedule of payments due. You will be able to pay via credit card (via PayPal), US check, Zelle or bank wire transfer.

1. \$500 deposit per person due with tour registration forms
2. 50% of costs due 6 months ahead of the tour
3. 100% of costs due 3 months ahead of the tour

### **CONFIRMATION AND CANCELLATION POLICY:**

The \$500 deposit is nonrefundable unless the tour is cancelled or rescheduled. Payments are 50% refundable up to 6 months before the tour begins; after that, any refund will depend on someone else taking your place on the tour, or you can request to join us on a future tour within twelve months, where your installments minus the deposit and any non-refundable deposits made by the supplier, will be credited to that tour. **We strongly recommend that all participants purchase comprehensive trip cancellation and interruption insurance in the event you need to cancel your travel plans.**

Egypt requires a passport that is valid for 6 months beyond your scheduled return date. A tourist visa is required and will be arranged ahead of time and given to you by our Meet and Greet agent upon your arrival at Cairo International Airport.
