An Introduction

Our travels will take us from the Great Giza Pyramids, to magnificent mosques, Pharaonic temples and to the oldest monastery in the world.

We will float on the life-giving waters of the great Nile River, smell the aromas of exotic spices piled high in a bustling *souk*, savor flatbread freshly baked in a clay oven, visit a Bedouin tent-shaped cathedral, hear the Muslim call to prayer from over a thousand minarets, stand on the shore of the Red Sea, experience the Sufi dancing of a whirling dervish, explore whale bones in the Western desert and so much more. All along, we will experience ancient and living spiritual traditions – Pharaonic, Islamic, Sufi, Coptic, Jewish, and desert spirituality.

To enhance our journey, art will be woven throughout our caravan - Coptic, Islamic, Ancient Pharaonic and contemporary Egyptian art. We will visit the new Grand Egyptian Museum on the Giza Plateau, marvel at the architecture of Pharaonic temples, see rock carvings in a sandstone amphitheater, contemplate ancient monastic frescoes and Coptic iconography, admire Islamic calligraphy, visit the studios of today’s premier Egyptian artists, and so much more.

ISLAMIC CAIRO

Visit:

- Museum of Civilization
- Sultan Hassan Mosque (Experience the Muezzin call to prayer).
- The Citadel (Mohamed Ali Mosque)
- Walking tour of Bab Zuweila and Tentmakers' Street

Breakfast: at hotel followed by a welcome/orientation meeting

Lunch: Maimi Palace with Sufi dancer

Tuesday**

COPTIC CAIRO (Souq al Fustat)

Visit:

- Coptic Christian Old Cairo including the Coptic Museum, Hanging Church, Ben Ezra Synagogue, Abu Serga Church, St. Barbara Church, St. Mercurius Church
- Afternoon visit to St. Simon “The Tanner” Monastery and Cave Church and Recycle Center in Mokattam area of Cairo (where many garbage collectors live, and where up to 13,000 meet in a cave church each Thursday evening). Known as well for its rock sculptures.

TUNIS/FAYOUM OASIS IN THE WESTERN DESERT

(whale bones, contemporary Egypt artist)

Visit:

- Visit Whale Bones Valley (UNESCO World Heritage Site) via 4 x 4 SUVs
- Visit with celebrated Egyptian contemporary artist Mohammed Abla, and see his studio as well as his Arab cartoon museum and contemporary art museum

SAKKARA NECROPOLIS

Visit:

- Sakkara Necropolis and Step Pyramid

- Merit Papyrus workshop
- Khan El Khalili bazaar – shopping in souk
- Tea at El Fishawy Café - one of oldest continually functioning cafes in the world

RED SEA & ARAB DESERT MONASTERY

Visit:

- Western shore of the Red Sea
- Oldest monastery in the world - St. Anthony's

**April 24
Saturday**

PHARAONIC CAIRO - THEN FLY TO LUXOR

Visit:

- Giza Pyramids and The Sphinx
(option for camel rides near the Pyramids)
- Drop-off at Cairo Domestic Airport and fly to Luxor:
- Transfer to overnight at Hilton Hotel Luxor

Lunch: 9 Pyramids Lounge

LUXOR

Visit:


- Valley of Kings (i.e. tomb of King Tut) and Hatshepsut Temple
- Visit an Alabaster workshop
- Sunset Tour of Luxor Temple & View of the Sphinx Avenue

We will explore how the ancient Egyptians left behind an immense collection of spiritual knowledge through their architecture, hieroglyph, art and symbols.

LUXOR - then fly to CAIRO


Visit:

- Visit Karnak Temple in ancient Thebes
The Karnak Temple took over 2,000 years to build and is the largest building ever constructed for religious purposes, which includes the Temple of Amun-Re and the Sacred Lake.
- Mid-afternoon flight to Cairo:
 - Transfer to back to original hotel in Cairo
 - Steigenberger Hotel Giza Pyramids

Tuesday**

GRAND EGYPT MUSEUM

- Visit the new Grand Egyptian Museum, the largest museum in the world, including the spectacular display of King Tut and King Khufu's solar ship.
- Followed by last minute shopping/packing in Cairo or a time of rest or an optional tour of Zamalek Island art galleries

April 28
Wednesday

DEPARTURE - morning departure (morning hotel check out required on April 28). *Note: international flights often depart late night of April 27 / early morning hours April 28.*

COSTS

Double occupancy (one or two beds): \$5,250

Single occupancy: \$5,650

If you are traveling alone but wish to share a room, please let us know when you register and we will attempt to find a suitable traveling companion. If we are unable to find someone, we will notify you of the supplemental cost needed for a single room.

INCLUDED IN TOUR COSTS:

- “Meet and Greet” before passport control at airport, transfer from/to airport
- Egyptian visa – provided upon arrival by “Meet and Greet” agent before passport control
- All ground transportation
- In country flight: Cairo to/from Luxor - Star Alliance Partner EgyptAir
- Hotel lodging at 4 and 5 star hotels
- All meals of breakfast, lunch and dinner (drinks: bottled water at meals and on bus)
- Private tour bus throughout the trip
- All entrance fees to sites
- Our own dedicated tour guides throughout the trip
- Tour hosted by President of CARAVAN Arts

NOT INCLUDED IN TOUR COSTS:

- International travel to and from Egypt
- Required travel health insurance and recommended comprehensive travel insurance (protection for cancellations, trip interruptions, lost baggage)
- Personal expenses
- Beverages: (coffee/tea/juice included at breakfast & water at meals and bus)

PAYMENTS:

After reviewing your inquiry form, we will email you further instructions on the registration process, including needed forms and payment options to submit a deposit of \$500 per person, along with a schedule of payments due. You will be able to pay via credit card (via PayPal), US check, Zelle or bank wire transfer.

1. \$500 deposit per person due with tour registration forms
2. 50% of costs due 6 months ahead of the tour
3. 100% of costs due 3 months ahead of the tour

CONFIRMATION AND CANCELLATION POLICY:

The \$500 deposit is nonrefundable unless the tour is cancelled or rescheduled. Payments are 50% refundable up to 6 months before the tour begins; after that, any refund will depend on someone else taking your place on the tour, or you can request to join us on a future tour within twelve months, where your installments minus the deposit and any non-refundable deposits made by the supplier, will be credited to that tour. **We strongly recommend that all participants purchase comprehensive trip cancellation and interruption insurance in the event you need to cancel your travel plans.**

Egypt requires a passport that is valid for 6 months beyond your scheduled return date. A tourist visa is required and will be arranged ahead of time and given to you by our Meet and Greet agent upon your arrival at Cairo International Airport.
